In this lecture, Edward will share his unique Visions of Japan with heartfelt ninjoinspired cultural and meditative insights, illustrated with a slideshow of his photographs.

Edward Levinson's photographs and writings appear in many Japanese books and magazines as well as in English publications; his works are regularly exhibited in Japan, the U.S., and Europe. In addition to "Whisper of the Land" (Fine Line Press), he has published two books of essays in Japanese with Iwanami Shoten, and an award-winning photo book, "Timescapes Japan". He lives on an idyllic hilltop in Kamogawa on the Boso Peninsula, where he maintains a natural garden, a source of inspiration for his writing and photography.
